Have a wonderful and safe half term.

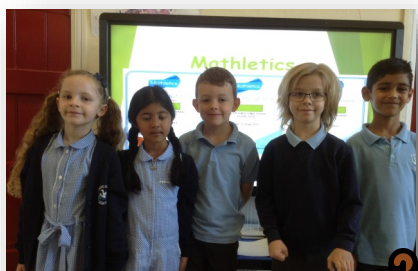


CLASS 2

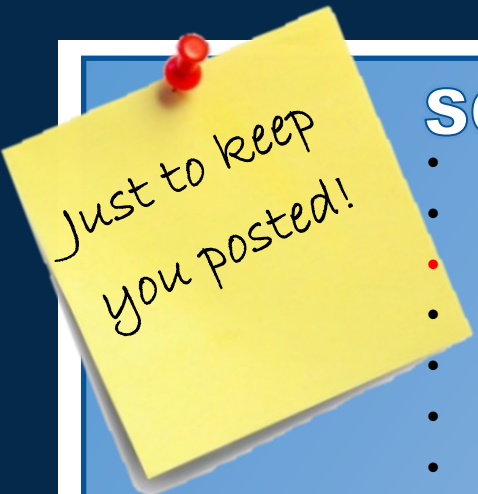

EDGMOND HALL TRIP—10TH JUNE – **CHANGE TO CLOTHING ADVICE**

Following the letter we sent about this trip, we have received some additional information about the clothing children need to wear. Children do not need to wear their school uniform, instead they will need to wear suitable old outdoor clothing—long trousers and long sleeved tops/fleeces with a waterproof coat and wellies. If the weather is warm they will still need sun hats and sun cream applied as necessary before school as they will be outside all day.
