#### CLASS 1

We are excited to be using the lovely book 'Here we are' by Oliver Jeffers over the next few weeks. We will think about our school as a community where we all support and value each other and think about ways to help children to understand their place in the wider world. In science year 1 have been learning about the importance of exercise and how it impacts on our body and our minds.

Year 1 have been looking how 5 can be partitioned in different ways. Reception have been comparing size, mass or capacity with lots of practical games and activities.

Year 1s are starting to have weekly spellings and work to do at home. New work will be given each Tuesday.



What a wonderful week we have had in Class 2! We have been busy making telescopes, like Auggie's, that search for kindness. Have you spotted any acts of kindness? We have now started our book Here we are by Oliver Jeffers. We have started to share what we know about our planet and the solar system. In maths the year 1 children have been busy looking at ways to make 5 including using a systematic approach and year 2 are using their knowledge of number facts to 10 to help them solve three addend equations. As part of our This is me! topic we have focused on our being healthy in science lessons. This week year 1 looked at how exercise affects our bodies and year 2 have sorted foods into the five groups. We are continuing to share the interesting facts about ourselves when we were babies, a big thank you to everyone who helped answer the questions.
