INFORMATION ON APPLYING FOR A PRIMARY SCHOOL PLACE TO START IN SEPTEMBER 2021

The online admissions application forms are now available at www.telford.gov.uk/admissions. The following deadlines apply this year:

- Applying for primary school places to start in September 2021 (starting school for the first time) - closing date 15 January 2021
- Applying for infant to junior school places to start in September 2021 (current Year 2 pupils) closing date 15 January 2021
- · If a child has an Education, Health & Care Plan the <u>closing date is 31st October 2020</u> for all applications.



Welcome back Class 2!

It has been lovely to see you all again. This week we have been recounting our half term break, thinking about why we remember the 5th of November and grouping materials in science. In maths year 2 have been using their number bonds to bridge a ten, for example

38+3 would be calculated by partitioning the 3 into 2 and 1 because 8 and 2 are a number bond to 10. Then you need to add the 1 on.

38+2=40 40+1=41

48+3 would be calculated by 48+2 then add 1 etc.

Year 1 maths has focused on odd and even numbers and how they can be partitioned for example the odd number 7 can be partitioned into 6 and 1, 5 and 2, 3 and 4, which means they partition into an odd and even number. If you partition for example 8 you will get 7 and 1, 6 and 2, 5 and 3 and 4 and 4 so you sometimes get and odd and odd, and sometimes even and even. If possible please support your child to access Mathletics at home, if you do not have their passwords then please let me know.

It has been wonderful to hear the children confidently sharing their school council speeches and answering their peers questions. We are looking forward to voting in our election very soon, it feels just like the election in America!
