

INFORMATION ON APPLYING FOR A PRIMARY SCHOOL PLACE TO START IN SEPTEMBER 2021

The online admissions application forms are now available at www.telford.gov.uk/admissions. The following deadlines apply this year:

- Applying for primary school places to start in September 2021 (starting school for the first time) - <u>closing date 15 January 2021</u>
- Applying for infant to junior school places to start in September 2021 (current Year 2 pupils) closing date 15 January 2021
- · If a child has an Education, Health & Care Plan the <u>closing date is 31st October 2020</u> for all applications.

Well done to all the children receiving a Mathletics award today. We were very impressed that nearly the whole class received an award, well done!





In English this week we have started to read our new text, The Toymaker by Martin Waddell. The children have made predictions about the story using the front cover and described the main characters using adjectives in expanded noun phrases 'the quiet little girl loved playing ...'. They are now beginning to retell the story focusing on the phrases the author uses.


In maths the year 1 group have been exploring the commutativity of addends in addition. They are enjoying investigating how many number facts there are for the numbers 6, 7 and 8 and using commutativity to find all solutions. Here's how Lacey use a system to find them all, well done!





In year 2 the group have been using a 100 square to help them see the pattern when adding and subtracting 10. The children looked carefully and found out the unit digit stays the same and the tens digit changes.

In science we are looking at the properties of materials. Year 2 have tested materials to see if they can stretch, bend, twist or squash and year 1 examined four different kinds of paper and they decided that we should not make a bag for Mrs Powell to carry her books in, from paper, because it wouldn't be strong enough.
