# CLASS-1

Another successful week in Class 1 with lots of work being completed at home and in school. Reception have been exploring numbers to 5. Finding different combinations of 5 and learning about the conservation of the number. No matter how we split the number the total stays the same. Year 1 have been looking at the number bonds to 20 by counting on .and using their knowledge of number bonds to 10. In our English lessons Reception have been looking at rhyming patterns and learning the phonic sounds 'igh' and 'oa'. Year 1 have continued their pirate story looking at punctuation and have learned the sounds 'ph', ew and oe.

On Thursday we made our own pancakes at home and at school. It was lovely to share this experience with each other. Thank you to all the home parents who got the ingredients, helped, and washed up too!

Snow days are always exciting, and we have lots of photos to capture the delight of the children. We will be taking part in the RSPB Great Britain Bird Watch next week so are planning ways to attract more birds into our gardens.



# CLASS 2

We have had another busy week in Class 2! Our new maths topic, time, has made us think about the length of a second and a minute. Did you know it takes 8 1/2

minutes to get into space in a rocket?

The children have started to focus on telling the time using the hour and minute hand. Can you remember which hand is longer, the minute or the hour hand? The children also enjoyed making paper chains by putting the months of the year in order.

There has been a real **buzz** in the classroom, and on Teams, with the children sharing their facts about space. What wonderful posters and rockets you have made Class 2! Year 2 What kind of sentence is that?

The children really enjoyed making their moving rocket with Miss Wiggin this week. They coloured the earth identifying the land and sea, then attached a flying rocket using a split pin as a pivot. The rocket then moves with the lever. We will set this as a task for the home learning next week. Next week also challenge yourself and aim for a Mathletics certificate.
