During Children's Mental Health Week 2021 we have been extra aware of the importance of the outdoor environment to help children escape and spend time doing simple tasks to observe and relax in nature. We spotted signs of Spring, watched clouds, and spent time exploring different ways of moving and having fun.

Our second week using Oliver Jeffer's 'Lost and Found' story inspired floating and sinking activities and letters to the penguin feeding back our findings. We also designed our homes with a penguin friend staying with us. Reception have looked at the composition of 6, 7 and 8. Year 1 have been looking at addition and subtraction to 20.

Next week sees the start of Chinese New Year so we will spend next Friday looking at the ways this is celebrated.

CLASS 2

Finally, February is here!

The children have made a fantastic start to this month working hard both at home and



in school. We have now started our new text The Journey Home by Frann Preston-Gannon.

The children have worked so hard discussing the animal characters in the book, learning about their characteristics and habitat. The children have been amazed to find out facts about the polar bears fur, watch how a seal and polar bear swims and where a polar bear's habitat is. It has wonderful to see the children enjoying their science learning through our story. We even found out that a narwhal's tusk is 3 metres long and we looked at this in our measuring sessions.

In maths we have looked at the direction the hands of the clock move, anti-clockwise and turning in quarter, half and full turns. We are now focusing on measuring and suitable units to measure with. Would you measure a sandwich with a metre stick? Could I measure the length of the classroom with my ruler? During the sessions we have used greater than and less than to compare our measurements. We will continue measuring next week, looking at why it is important to use accurate measuring.
