In maths year 1 have been adding 1 and subtracting 1 and finding numbers with a difference of 1. Reception have looked at the patterns of counting in numbers from 1 to 20.

It has been wonderful to see everyone back in school for our final term of the year. With the weather being so beautiful it has been a great opportunity for us to look and listen for signs of Spring. As a class we have read the poem Out

and About by Shirley Hughes and then created our own version using what we see and hear around as our inspiration.

In science we imagined we were weather forecasters and wrote a description of the weather for that day. If I remember correctly, in Wales it is raining, in England there are thunderstorms and in Scotland there will be a heatwave!

In maths year 1 children are working on grouping large amounts in tens to help their counting of large quantities be quicker and more accurate. In year 2 the children are using their multiplication skills to help them solve division problems. We have focused on the language

'dividend, divisor and quotient.' 8 + 2 = 4 dividend divisor quotient

Class 2 will be doing a PE session on a Monday **and** Friday. Please can the children come to school in PE kits on these days.

Well done to all the Winners your design ideas were blingtastic. We hope you had fun making your creations and enjoyed your extra playtime to enjoy some fun scooter time.






