
## CLASS 2

It's been another busy week in Class 2 and the weather has definitely not dampened our spirits. We have been very busy planting sunflower seeds and checking on our seeds in school. We have some radish, spinach, beetroot,

In maths year 1 are using different representations to partition tens and units and to solve word problems.



Year 2 we are consolidating our TU+TU knowledge partitioning the tens and units and recombining.
