We have been making sure they only count one at a time to help with their 1:1 correspondence. You can help at home by counting out everyday objects such as spoons, toys, socks etc. As well as saying a number such as five and encouraging your child to clap, jump, tap that number.

They are very keen and proud to be learning their phonics and have been learning t, i and n. They might want to show you how they can form these letters or hear words that start with these sounds.

The children have been having a great time with their stories and it was The Three Billy Goats Gruff that have captured their interest this week. They have had fun recalling events from the story and of course the repetitive part of the story "Who's that trip trapping over my bridge" is always good fun.

Cosmic Yoga is going well, and the children are beginning to follow the actions and positions with more awareness. This also helps the children develop their listening skills and their ability to follow instructions.


Once upon a time in Class 2
