The free swimming lesson course of 13 weeks is being offered to ALL children aged 5 to 10 who currently cannot swim 10 meters on their front and back.


You can enrol by contacting your nearest council owned swimming pool.

- Applying for Reception Year school places to start in September 2023 (starting school for the first time) - closing date 15 January 2023
- Applying for Infant to Junior school (Year 2 into Year 3) places to start in September 2023 (current Year 2 pupils) closing date 15 January 2023
- If a child has an Education, Health & Care Plan the closing date is <u>31st October 2022</u> <u>for all applications.</u>

In science we have been focusing on ourselves and

what we need to grow and stay healthy. The year 2 children have explored the different stages of the human life cycle, the differences between the needs of human babies and other baby animals,

looked at food groups and discussed which foods belong to each one. The year 1 children

have focused on the need to eat, drink and be clean. This week they looked at how important exercise is and how it affects the body.

The year 1 children have been busy looking at pieces

of fruit as a whole and cutting it into parts. This will lead into learning in the near future when we will talk about part, part whole models.




