LOOKING FOR A SCHOOL PLACE SEPTEMBER 2023?


The online admissions application process is now available at www.telford.gov.uk/admissions.


The following deadlines apply this year:

- Applying for Reception Year school places to start in September 2023 (starting school for the first time) - closing date 15 January 2023
- Applying for Infant to Junior school (Year 2 into Year 3) places to start in September 2023 (current Year 2 pupils) closing date 15 January 2023
- If a child has an Education, Health & Care Plan the closing date is <u>31st October 2022</u> for all applications.

In phonics this week we have learned the sounds u, b, f and e. We found lots of sounds scattered around the playground and learned that we can blend the sounds together to make words!


What a lovely, fun week to end a fabulous half term! We hope you all have a fantastic week off and look forward to hearing all about your adventures when we return to school on the 31st!
