The following deadlines apply this year:

- Applying for Reception Year school places to start in September 2023 (starting school for the first time) - closing date 15 January 2023
- Applying for Infant to Junior school (Year 2 into Year 3) places to start in September 2023 (current Year 2 pupils) - closing date 15 January 2023
- If a child has an Education, Health & Care Plan the closing date is <u>31st October 2022</u> <u>for all applications.</u>







Well, it's been a horrible rainy week, but on Tuesday Mrs Reynolds saw a rainbow so beautiful that we all had to leave our maths and go outside and look at it! It really cheered us all up.

In Maths this week Reception have been comparing numbers, talking about more than and fewer than, too many or not enough, and introducing the concept of 'equal'.

Our year 1 children are reinforcing their knowledge of 5 and how it can be partitioned into 2 or more parts. The children have explored this in many ways including problem solving.

In English we have been reading a new book set in India, 'Princess Anjula's Jungle Adventure' and we have been predicting what might happen in the story. Reception have been learning about the Taj Mahal and Year 1 have been finding out where in the world India is, and what continent it is in.

We have continued our learning about Autumn this week and have used crunchy autumn leaves to decorate a hedgehog and to make a cosy den for a bear. We also had a think about what our bear would need to wear on an Autumn walk.

Reception's new sounds this week have been **v**, **y**, **w**, **th** and **z**. We know a lot of sounds now and are practising blending them together to make words.


The class have made a wonderful start to our new topic 'India'. They have been busy using a map and an atlas to locate India in the world, learning what continent it is part of and the countries that border it.

Did you know there are 6 countries that border India?


For homework we have asked the children to research something they are interested in about India, and we are looking forward to seeing the work and hearing the facts in the next few weeks.

In maths the Year 2 children are adding and Pot A has more seeds than Pot B. There are five seeds subtracting 10 and looking at the impact it has on a two-digit number.

Our Year 1 children are reinforcing their knowledge of 5 and how it can be partitioned into 2 or more parts. The children have explored this in many "How many seeds might be in each pot?" ways including problem solving.
