CLASS 1



It's been another miserable rainy week but we've been cheered up by all the lovely India projects that have been coming into school, you have been working hard!

Reception have learned ch, qu, x, ng and nk in Phonics this week- we have now finished Set 1! Well done everyone, the emphasis is now on blending and then you really will be readers!

In Maths, reception have been learning about how a whole is made up of parts, so toys can be made from different parts, and all of our body parts make up us.

Year one have been matching numbers, quantities and numerals and started to work on the 'five and a bit structure' - '6 is five and 1 more'

We learned about Hannukah in RE and have been finding out more about India- and we were amazed to learn that Mrs Wellman has driven a tuktuk!

We have been reading the classic story 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' this week, and guess what?...We had a tiger called Sunny arrive in our classroom on Wednesday! We couldn't believe our eyes! He had travelled all the way from India where it is very hot so we made sure he was very warm and cosy. He was also very hungry from his long journey so we made him lots of yummy tiger food! We had to put Sunny back in his cage at lunchtime as tigers love meat and it was roast dinner for lunch!

Have a lovely weekend and keep an ear out for Sunny's very loud roar, it can be heard two miles away!





CLASS 2



Class 2 have made me so proud with their new learning about our topic India. I am looking forward to seeing the research the children have done led by what they are interested in.

In art the children have been studying the work of Ladi Kwali and how she has used clay as a natural material to do coiling and then use these to make pots. So far, we have created our own pot designs and used the coiling technique to make a snail. Here is some of our work.







This week we completed our work about Pattan's Pumpkin with a sequenced retell. I have been very impressed with how the children have used description to create interesting sentences to excite the reader.

Here are a few snippets of some of the children's sentences they wrote. 'One sunny day Pattan and Kanni lived in a quiet calm valley. They tended the bulls and rode with the elephants.' Pattan grabbed the ailing plant and put it in the garden.' 'The pumpkin grew and grew until it was bigger than the Sahyadri mountains.'



All the children in school are working hard practising the songs for the nativity we will perform in December. Some of the children have speaking lines to rehearse so look out for any scripts in your child's book bag and please could we ask you to help them learn their lines, thank you!
