If your child requires a costume for the school play we have lots available in school. Please speak to your class Teacher to arrange a time to pop in to take a look.




LOOKING FOR A SCHOOL PLACE SEPTEMBER 2023?

The online admissions application process is now available at www.telford.gov.uk/admissions.

The following deadlines apply this year:

- Applying for Reception Year school places to start in September 2023 (starting school for the first time) - closing date 15 January 2023
- Applying for Infant to Junior school (Year 2 into Year 3) places to start in September 2023 (current Year 2 pupils) closing date 15 January 2023
- · If a child has an Education, Health & Care Plan the closing date is 31st October 2022 for all applications.

CLASS 1

We have been absolutely blown away by the amazing projects that have been coming into school this week! We can't believe how hard you have all worked! We have had cardboard models, lego models, Holi celebrations, posters, books, food, flags, rangoli patterns, maps and even a balloon and a zoo! We have loved listening to the children telling us proudly about their work. Thank you so much parents for all the help you have given your children, they have clearly loved it and learned a lot.

Reception haven't been learning any new sounds this week, instead we have been assessing the children and practising blending the sounds they already know. The children get so excited to show us words they have been able to both read and write, it is lovely to see!

In maths Reception have been focussing on the composition of 4 and thinking about how 4 spots and squares in different colours and orientations are still 4.

Year 1 have been working on the concept of numbers 6-9 as ' 5 and a bit'.

Our focus text this week has been a Bengali folk tale called 'Jamil's Clever Cat.' We have been weaving like Jamil the weaver, using marbles and paint to make Sardul the cat and have been writing about the animal noises discussed in the book.

Our Christmas play rehearsals are going very well, I think the songs are going to be stuck in our heads forever!




In maths this week the year 1 children have been learning about numbers 6, 7, 8, and 9 being 5 and a bit.
