If you have a child born between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019, they are due to start primary school in September 2023. You can apply for a reception class place until 15 January 2023.

You will need to apply to the Local Authority in which you live, but you can apply to schools outside of your Local Authority area should you wish.

- · If a child has an Education, Health & Care Plan the closing date is 31st October 2022 for all applications.






CHRISTMAS CARDS

What shape could Whitney be thinking of?


Are there any other shapes it could be? What shape is Whitney definitely not thinking about? How do you know? I wonder if she is thinking of a pentagon?


In year 1 the children have been positioning numbers on a number line and explaining their reasoning.
