- Applying for Infant to Junior school (Year 2 into Year 3) places to start in September 2023 (current Year 2 pupils) closing date 15 January 2023
- If a child has an Education, Health & Care Plan the closing date is <u>31st October 2022 for</u> all applications.

In art this week we have continued our learning about clay and used the coiling technique to make a snail!

Have a lovely, cosy weekend and we'll see you next week for the last week of term!




The children have made me so proud practising their parts and still working hard in their lessons. In maths the year 2 children have been exploring shape.

They have been investigating the properties of shapes and using this to reason.



What shape could he have?

In year 1 the children are focusing on odd and even numbers and what happens when they are partitioned into two parts.



When I partition an odd number, I will get two even numbers. Am I correct? How do you know?

In art we have been creating our coil pots. We had to roll the clay into long tube shapes and layer them onto the base. We used hatching to mark the clay and slip to help it stick together.
