

In phonics we have recapped the sounds oo (book), ar, or, air and ir. The children getting speedier with their reading now. We remind the children that they can spot and remember repeated words rather than sounding them out every time.

In maths reception have been thinking about length, height and distance.


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Year one have started to look at addition and commutativity.

We have come to the end of another half term, and I can't believe we are halfway through the year already! The children have thoroughly enjoyed the 'Ship Ahoy!' topic. They have gained lots of knowledge about what pirates regarded as treasure, how they dressed and have learned lots of fantastic facts about the explorer Christopher Columbus.

In science we have explored different materials that would be suitable to cover a porthole on a ship. We used a torch to test the opacity of the materials and shared our observations with the class.





In computing the class enjoyed programming the Beebots to follow a command. We learnt about the different buttons and how we can programme the Beebot to move forwards, backwards, left and right. Sometimes the commands we used didn't work so we had to keep trying! It was wonderful to see the resilience of the children as they were determined not to give up.

In year 2 maths this week we have focused on doubling. First, we doubled numbers to 10 then 20. Next, we looked at numbers with a 5 in the units.
