We have had a lovely, busy week in Class 1! The Reception children had a fantastic time at Forest School on Wednesday! We had much better weather this time compared to the very rainy session they had last time! They particularly loved working together to build fire, making their own bird feeders, digging in the mud and swinging on the zip wire!

This week we read the story of St George- we particularly liked the gory bit where he killed the dragon! We have also been learning all about the different ways that St. George's Day is celebrated in this country, we were very surprised to find out that Class 1 seems to have a Morris dancing expert!

In English we have all been working hard on our independent sentence writing and we are really pleased with the children's progress. We have linked our English and Science lessons again this week as we have been learning about the life cycle of a frog. We are so impressed that the children all remembered that VERY big word 'metamorphosis' that we learned last week and they also noticed that, just like butterflies, frogs go through metamorphosis too!







In maths Reception have been working on subitising '6 and not 6' and we all made different patterns of 6 outside. Unfortunately, a cheeky bird flew off with some of our objects while we were counting butterflies so we had to work out which patterns were now not 6! Then Mrs Harris was very naughty and changed our patterns when our backs were turned so we were kept





hard at work subitising to find out which patterns were still 6!

Year 1 have been focusing on counting in 10s and adding multiples of 10.

We have had some caterpillars arrive in our classroom this week. They are busy munching their way through the special caterpillar food at the moment and the children are excited to watch them grow, go

into their chrysalis' and emerge as beautiful butterflies over the next few weeks!



In Art we have started to look at felting. The children felt lots of different wools and then chose 2 colours to blend together and roll into balls. We are putting all the balls together and we will end up with one super long and colourful caterpillar.










In maths the year 1 children have continued to consolidate their knowledge of multiples of ten. the children can use their number bond to ten knowledge to solve missing number problems.


The year 2 children have been focusing on two-digit addition and subtraction equations and how we can use a number line to solve these.


