




# WELCOME TO CLASS 1 PAGE


We are ending our weird and wonderful week with a visit from Exotic Zoo which will be very exciting and interesting!








## CLASS 2 PAGE

Class 2 have been enjoying exploring food chains in our science lesson and the children were introduced to the vocabulary producer, consumer and predator. They then sorted animals in the correct order in a food chain, remembering the arrow always points to the direction the energy is going. Here is an example of some food chains they made.





In English we have been reading our new text Mr Wolf and the Enormous Turnip. The children have loved the similar story line to our previous texts and have made fantastic predictions of what might happen next with the all the different characters that we can see.

In history we looked at life in the 1950s when Elizabeth II was crowned Queen and how it is different to today. The children were amazed at how not all families had a television or car and that milk was delivered in a glass bottle to the front door.
