Dear parents

There has been lots going on this week. Well done to the four children from Year 1 who represented our school at the 10 by 10 event for Telford Council this week. Year 1 also enjoyed their last visit to forest school for a while, they were full of enthusiasm for all the activities and work and play so cooperatively together which is super to see.

Dr Janet Bennett our Chair of Governors came into school to spend time with the children discussing their writing and how it has improved since she visited last time. She spent time talking to Year 2 children about their Read Write Inc spelling work and how it was helping them remember their spellings and be able to use them effectively in their independent writing. I am always very proud to hear them explain what they have been learning about and what them helps them learn more.

IMPORTANT

Dear Parents

We will be extending our school day from September 2023. This has been brought about by the Governments requirement to ensure all schools operate a 32.5-hour week.

I have consulted with our Governors and Mr Bussey Headteacher of Moorfield where most of our children move on to. This is to ensure that any changes to start and finish times are coordinated to enable time for dropping off and picking up of siblings.

Therefore, at Church Aston Infant School doors will open at 8:40am with registration at 8:45am. The end of the school day will be 3:15pm.

Our after school clubs will run from 3:15pm until 4:15pm. The 4 O Clock club will now run from 4:15pm until 5pm.

Correspondingly Moorfield's doors will open at 8:45am with registration at 8:55am. The end of their school day will be **3:25pm**. These changes have also been communicated to parents at Moorfield.

Government guidance is that the 32.5 hour minimum expectation includes the time in each day from the official start of the school day (i.e. morning registration) to the official end to the compulsory school day (i.e. official home time). The 32.5 hour minimum includes breaks and lunch times as well as teaching time.






3 + 2 = 5




In maths the year 1 learners have been securing their knowledge of doubles and halves and how to add to ten numbers.
