












In phonics this week the reception children have learned the sounds i, n, p, g and o. They were amazed when we blended the sounds we have learned together to read actual words!

In English we have continued our work on The Colour Monster Goes to School. The Year One children created a bank of adjectives to use in their sentences to describe the Colour Monster. The Reception children had a go at writing the initial sounds in words from the text.

In maths Reception have been helping Maths Mouse count objects, sounds and actions accurately.

STAR OF THE WEEK

Class 2

It has been a very busy week in Class 2! The children are impressing me with their independent writing skills as they apply their phonics to the new vocabulary and learn to work in new table places.



This week we started our computing learning for this term. We looked at the information technology we have around us and discussed how it is used in school. I would now like the

children to look at what you have at home and discuss with you how it works and what it is used for.



In year 1 maths the children have been learning about how to compare numbers. They watched Numberblocks and were introduced to Blockzilla who likes to play with the *greater* number. The children have used the symbols; greater than, less than and equal to, to compare numbers.



In year 2 the children have used their number 'Fill in the missing numbers.' bond to ten knowledge to complete three addend equations. Once the children have found the number bond to ten, they then added on the third addend.

Polite reminder – Please can you make sure your child has all their clothes named so we can return any misplaced items to the right person promptly and we will need coats with a hood, in school every day, as we often play outside if the rain is not too heavy and walk to the Village Hall for PE. Thank you!
