We have been as busy as the farmers harvesting this week in Class One!

Our focus text this week has been The Scarecrows' Wedding by Julia Donaldson.

The children shared what they already know about scarecrows and their important job protecting the crops from the naughty birds!

The children then wrote lists of what they needed to make a scarecrow, went on a hunt for the items they needed (just like the scarecrows do in the story) and then used them to build their own scarecrows! We now have some fantastic dingle, dangle scarecrows in our garden area!





In phonics this week Reception learnt the sounds j, v, y, w and th.

In maths Reception have been thinking about the words more than and fewer than. They had to decide if Teddy or Maths Mouse had more or fewer bears. We used the stem sentence 'Bear has more/fewer bears than Maths Mouse.'

- · Applying for Infant to Junior school (Year 2 into Year 3) places to start in September 2024 (current Year 2 pupils) - closing date 15 January 2024
- If a child has an Education, Health & Care Plan the closing date is 31st October 2023 for all applications.
