Dear Class One. Hello! We hope you are all well.








In maths the year 1 children have matched amounts, numerals and number words. They will move onto exploring the composition of each number 6 to 10.

The following deadlines apply this year:


- Applying for Reception Year school places to start in September 2024 (starting school for the first time) - closing date 15 January 2024
