ways of using the same four commands to create different programs to move the beebot over the mats. The children used prediction and logic to work out their routes.




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The year 2 children have been working on partitioning tens and units then recombing them to TU plus a multiple of 10.

- Applying for Reception Year school places to start in September 2024 (starting school for the first time) - closing date 15 January 2024
- Applying for Infant to Junior school (Year 2 into Year 3) places to start in September 2024 (current Year 2 pupils) - closing date 15 January 2024
- If a child has an Education, Health & Care Plan the closing date is 31st October 2023 for all applications.
