Bratton Pack

School is very aware that parents need good wrap around care. Bratton Pack is an independent organisation that provide this for parents of children at St Peter's. It is run by a management committee.

Although Bratton Pack are independent, we do work together as we both want the same thing – good wrap around care. We are becoming aware though that there are times when Bratton Pack is going to become full. The rooms used have a limit of 48 children for this type of use. School don't want parents to be left in the situation of not having wrap around care. Therefore, school is happy to organise additional wrap around care that takes place at school, to create more place availability. We will work with Bratton Pack so that we know when they are likely to become full and will then release information to parents about how school will help with that. If you, as parents, have difficulty booking a place at Bratton Pack, please let our school office know.

School is very aware that parents need good wrap around care and we want to work with the provider on our site to make sure parent's needs are met.
