Year 5

This week Year 5 have been exploring plant reproductive cycles. We dissected lilies to explore the different parts that make up a flower, and used this information to help us learn about the flower reproductive cycle. After we developed our understanding of how seeds form, we planted our own sunflower seeds so we can begin a new cycle of plant reproduction.

Year 5 will be taking their sunflowers home to look after and there will be a competition to see whose has grown the tallest.

Football Success

3 of our Y5 boys have played for Telford Utd U10s this season in the Midlands Junior Premier league. They recently played in the Cup Final and have shared their success and experience with their class. This is a report from one of the players.

Telford Utd U10 MJPL Cup Final.

"Today was the day... it was our Midlands Junior Premier League (MJPL) cup final for Telford Utd U10s. We had to travel to Coleshill Town FC where the final was being played (The journey felt so long). It was a really big match and I was feeling nervous, not wanting to let my team down and thinking about how the match would go. When we finally arrived we were all very excited but focussed. Warming up, team talks by our Manager and Coaches was part of the nervous build up. When the whistle blew to start the team knew we had to work hard.
